| 28 29 30 31 | SB 337 amended Texas Labor Code, Chapter 302, Subchapter A by adding §302.00341, Grants to Facilitate Participation in Apprenticeship Training Programs by Certain Veterans and Military Personnel. |
| 32 33 34 35 | Texas Labor Code, §302.00341(a) defines "apprenticeship training program" and "nonprofit organization." |
| 36 37 38 39 | Texas Labor Code, §302.00341(b) requires TWC to "develop and administer a program under which the commission may award grants to one or more nonprofit organizations duty military service members who are transitioning into civilian employment." |
